- Students **will not** be provided a snack in the program. Please send an additional nut free snack for your child to enjoy during Kids Club activities.
- There will be no club programming on half days.
- Please be sure your child is aware of the clubs he/she will be attending each day. Please make note of the dates on the calendar that are marked 'No Clubs'.
- All materials required for participation are included in the cost of the program.
- Programs may have differing prices due to varying costs of running each program and the number of days each program is in session.
- Each club has a maximum number of students that can be accommodated and a minimum number of students required to be registered in order for the club to be offered. The maximum participation and minimum required participation are not adjustable.
- All fees are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- Children who are in the regular after school program will be escorted at the end of their club by a designated teacher. Students are not allowed to leave the school building between school dismissal and the start of the Kids Club or athletic activity.
- There will be no make-up classes due to weather related issues or unforeseeable circumstances.
- Payment will be made through Smart Tuition. Families will be billed directly on the October statement.
   Failure to pay Kids Club program fees will result in denied services and forfeiture of the opportunity to register for future club activities.
- Dismissal from Kids Club activities will take place out of all three doors (recess yard, east side door, & west side door). The instructor will reach out prior to the first day of programming with dismissal information.
- You will receive a welcome email from each Kids Club teacher at the start of the semester and a second email halfway through the semester to provide an update on your child's participation in the program.
- Please note that the satisfactory completion of school assignments and homework are our priorities
  for all of our students. Kids Club and athletic activities are always secondary to completing homework
  and school assignments.
- Kids Club activities are educational and enjoyable, but participation is a privilege that is earned
  through positive interactions, cooperation, mutual respect and adherence to the school's policies and
  procedures. Students who fail to observe the school's code of conduct, or follow the Club teacher's
  behavioral requirements, will be subject to usual school disciplinary consequences, which may include
  dismissal from the program.

- Registration is completed online. A form will be emailed to you at 12:00pm on Thursday, September 8th
- Registration is first come, first served.
- The registration form should be filled out **once** for **EACH** child. Please do not fill out multiple registration forms for one child. If you believe you made a mistake, please send an email to kidsclubs@saintstephenschool.org. All double registrations will result in the removal from all clubs.
- If you are registering for more than one child, you must complete a form for EACH child. Siblings will be given preference to a club as long as the time stamp on the registration form is no longer than 10 minutes apart.
- If your child is placed on the waitlist for any club you will be notified via email the morning of Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>. At that time, you will be advised of clubs with available spaces and will have until the close of registration on Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 p.m. to make a substitute choice.
- Club confirmation emails will be sent out on Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup>. If you do not receive a confirmation email **AFTER** 5:00pm on Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> please send an email to the Kids' Club email listed above.
- Once you have submitted your registration form, you are committing to the club and will not be able to swap that enrollment for another club.
- A late registration fee of \$25 will be charged per club and per child to anyone who would like to sign up for Kids Clubs *after* registration has closed on Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, provided space is available.

# **Monday Clubs**

#### **ELA Seminar** with Ms. Alexandra Williams

Open to students in Grades 6 to 8

This ELA seminar will be discussing novels, plays, practicing students' writing skills, and also have the opportunity to ask more in-depth questions about students' ELA skills. Some of the books and plays we will be reading: Emma, Midsummer Night's Dream, Pride and Prejudice, The Lord of the Rings, To Kill a Mockingbird, The Crucible, The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes , The Divergent Series, and Tuck Everlasting. This seminar is to help students prepare for high school and also to introduce them to classical literature.

#### Pokémon Club with Ms. Lissett Delgado

Open to students in Grades 1 to 6

Do you love Pokémon? Maybe you just want to learn to play with your friends? At the Pokémon Club we welcome anyone from trainers as experienced as Ash to those just starting out to come and join in the fun! Each week everyone will either learn or be able to jump right in and start with Pokémon cards, or watch episodes so they can learn how to be the best trainer they can be. If you want to have fun with your friends and play your favorite games come to the Pokémon Club!

Trading Pokémon cards will be allowed and supervised to make sure everyone is trading fairly. If you're not interested in trading, email me and your child won't trade unless I'm updated.

#### **Drawing Club** with Ms. Jess Cerrone

Open to students in PreK-4 to Grade 2

Unwind after the school day in drawing club! Each week we will be working on our drawing and fine motor skills, and learning how to draw something new. We'll start each session by reading a story together, then create a drawing project based on each book, working with all different kinds of art materials. Explore your creativity in drawing club!

#### Chess with Hex & Co.

Open to students in Grades 1 to 4

Developing minds learn how pieces move and how to organize approach and defense in this introduction to chess and related abstract strategy games. No experience is necessary and time is dedicated to learning these games in small group play. Each class is spent playing both chess and games like Ynich, Abalone, Hive, and Othello.

#### Strategy Specialist with Hex & Co.

Open to students in Grades 4 to 8

We spend one week playing a new game, which involves instruction, consideration of "methods of approach" and strategies for gameplay. The second week is designed to allow participants to have a more in-depth experience by revisiting and reviewing the games and exploring various strategies and novel problem-solving skills. We then move on to a new set of games, in another two-week series, through to the end of the session.

#### **Sewing Stuffed Animals** with Ms. Katie Hultz Villareal

Open to students in Grades 1 to 8

Do you love stuffed animals? Do you want to learn how to design and sew your own stuffed animal creations? Join the sewing stuffed animals club! In this club students will learn some simple stitches to sew their stuffed animals by hand. After one guided project students dive into creating and sewing their own stuffed animals. Students generally complete between two and four different stuffed animals over the semester - depending on their level and the size of their creations. You do not need to know how to sew to join this club - I will be there to help you learn. Come create with us!

#### SSH Cheerleading with Mrs. Kelly Schmidt

Open to students in Kindergarten to Grade 4

Are you full of SSH spirit and want the world to hear it? Well, this is the club for you! We will learn cheers, chants, and a dance. We will also perform at our school pep rally and other events. Make new friends, exercise, and have fun with the SSH Cheerleaders! Can't wait to see you there!

#### Kids Kitchen with Ms. Jenn Roche and Ms. Maureen Massaroni

Open to students in PreK-4 to Grade 2

Let's get cooking! Students are invited to embark on a culinary adventure with Ms. Maureen and Ms. Jenn! Let's explore fun and tasty recipes, all while learning about nutrition, measurements, and important culinary tools. The best part? On the final week of Kids Kitchen, students will each bring home their very own cookbook filled with all of the recipes we used! Let's put those taste buds to the test!

#### F2FBFF with Mrs. Kelly Strain

Open to students in Grade 5

This social-emotional club focuses on teaching girls\* how to build face-to-face friendships by working through what it means to be a good friend. Through journaling and team-building activities, we will work through 30 guidelines that teach the participants how to build strong friendships. This class will go over self-awareness, self-confidence, how to be a good friend, how to choose friends wisely, and how to use correct techniques for conflict resolution. Participants will receive an F2FBFF tool kit that includes: a personal Friendship Guidebook/Journal, folder, fun pen and pencil, vinyl stickers, and a bookmark all in a cute tote to keep it organized. Also, stay tuned for the F2FBFF Spring Session which will be a continuation of this program that will be offered to both 5th and 6th Grade. \*Although this program is designed for girls, it is open to all genders!

#### Force Basketball Academy with Force Basketball Coaches

Open to students in Grades 3-5

#### Creative Writing with Ms. Jessica Gonzalez

Open to students in Kindergarten to Grade 2

Here is a chance for your children to get a boost in their writing skills while also gaining the wonderful opportunity to express themselves creatively through writing! Children will use words connected to art, drawing, etc. for self expression, journaling and creative thoughts. Each week, children will explore the art of daily journaling using prompts, pictures, and other resources to engage and open their minds. Children will also dabble in story telling individually and in groups, even going as far as creating theatrical performances for their peers using their stories. The possibilities are endless here in "Creative Writing Club!"

#### Around the World with Ms. Katie Hultz Villareal

Open to students in Grades K-8

Do you love to travel and learn about other cultures? Join the Around the World Club! Each week we 'travel' to a new country. We have a snack from that country, do a traditional craft, and fill out our passports with things we have discovered. Say 'cheese' for your passport photo, and come travel with us!

#### STEAM Engineers with Ms. Evelyn Koch

Open to students in Grades 3-5

Does your child want to design, engineer, and test their creations in a STEAM challenges club? Each session will have a read aloud book or real life event connecting to the challenge of the day. Students will have the opportunity to work as a team to problem solve and think critically as they complete the engaging challenges. The STEAM engineers will follow the design process: ask, imagine, plan, create, experiment, and improve. Students will be able to eat their own snack during the read-aloud. Let's start creating our STEAM innovations!

#### Crime Scene Investigators with Ms. Aggie Koch

Open to students in Grades 6-8

Crime Scene Investigators will explore the world of forensic science. Students will be new recruits learning the skills needed to solve the crime. These activities will be an engaging way for students to practice using their logic, inference, analysis, and critical thinking skills. Students will learn more about fingerprinting, evidence collection, crime scene analysis, chromatography, toxicology, and blood typing. The club culminates in a true crime scene investigation where they will solve the crime before the evidence disappears! Will the guilty party escape?

#### Arts & Crafts with Ms. Lissett Delgado

Open to students in PreK-4 to Grade 5

Hey Artists! You are going to be given different types of materials (paint, glue, clay, cotton, etc.) and a theme of the day to create! Use your mind to find what that theme looks like to you! Mix and match to shape your art and bring it to life! Take your work home afterwards and share your creativity with friends and family! Some days there will be challenges like "Must contain the color green" or "Must use cotton balls" to see how you will add this challenge to your art!

#### **SportsWorld** with Parker Anderson Enrichment.

Open to students in Grades 2-5

The SportsWorld program is a fun and exciting way for kids to develop their motor skills while learning the basics of many different sports and games. Dribbling, passing, shooting, and hand-eye coordination are all practiced as students play basketball, soccer, dodge ball, capture the flag, and much, much, more. Our emphasis is on sportsmanship.

# **Thursday Clubs**

#### Debate and Forensics with Ms. Alexandra Williams

Open to students in Grades 5-8

In Debate and Forensics students will grow in their confidence to public speak, learn about (Drama, Humor, Oral Interpretation, or Duo), and present their pieces to their teammates and compete in competitions. Forensics is the collective term for both speech and debate. Most tournaments have both speech and debate events, and student commonly "double enter" or "cross enter" and compete in one debate event and one or two speech events at the same tournament.

#### Clay Club with Mrs. Ros Sterling

Open to students in Grades K-8

Clay Club members will explore different ceramics techniques like pinch pots, coils, and slabs to create lots of different self-directed projects. Students with more experience will get to invent their own projects if they wish, and students who are just starting out will get lots of hands-on time and instruction. This club is a fun way to work with clay!

#### Board Game Mania with Ms. Lissett Delgado

Open to students in Grade 2 to Grade 8

Bored? You won't be with these board games! You will be competing against your friends with a mystery game pulled out of a hat! The game will choose you and 1-3 other friends to play! The winners of each competition will get to pick from the special treat bin! However, everyone is a winner and will go home with a treat at the end of the day! Think and strategize a way to win!

#### Fairytales and Classics with Ms. Laurel Wyatt

Open to students in Kindergarten to Grade 3

Open to students in Grades K-8

# School Sponsored Extracurricular Activities

Join the CYO track team in the fall and get prepared for the meets in the spring! In the fall, students will have time to practice and stay fit. Track meets begin in April and will run through May. The season culminates in June at the CYO New York Championships. Fees help cover the cost of bus transportation to and from the track meets, as well as registration fees and league fees. The track team also asks parents for assistance with chaperoning these meets in the Spring.

**Please note:** Sponsoring a St. Stephen School track team represents a significant investment by the coach, the school, and the parents. To create the best possible athletic and team experience for our students, St. Stephen School asks its track athletes to also make an investment: students must complete at least 80% of team practices for the year in order to be sponsored by St. Stephen School for participation in spring track meets. Please do not register if you cannot or do not wish to practice after school with the team and follow all of the policies and procedures outlined by the coaching staff and administration to become eligible to participate in meets. We want this to be a true team experience for our student athletes and ask for their full commitment, along with the support of their parents. Practices are held after school at Carl Schurz Park (weather permitting) or in the auditorium.
